Subject: RE

Intent:

That submission is about recognising that Allah is to be obeyed at all times. That Muslims believe:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> That Allah is the one true God; the most important being in the universe. That Allah should be obeyed in every way and Muslims trust him to tell them the right thing to do. That praying five times a day helps them to remember to submit to Allah in all they do. 	<p>What difference did Paul's conversion on the Damascus road make to Christians? Conversion is about change. Before his conversion, Paul thought Christians needed to stop spreading lies that Jesus was God's Son. After his conversion, Paul became a follower of Jesus. He travelled around the world to tell people the good news about Jesus. His purpose in life changed. Christians believe:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Paul persecuted Christians then became one. Paul wrote to those he helped become Christians. These letters are now in the New Testament and are read in churches; they provide guidance on Christian living. The Holy Spirit lives inside them and helps them to become more like Jesus. <p>How do Sikhs put their beliefs about equality into practice? Sikhs believe everyone is equal. No one is 	<p>What spiritual pathways to Moksha are written about in Hindu scriptures? Moksha is freedom from the cycle of birth-death-rebirth (samsara). That Hindus believe:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Life is a journey towards re-union with God and there are different pathways to achieve this. Hindus read from the Gita for guidance, comfort and advice. Most Hindus follow Bhakti yoga which teaches people can reach moksha through loving devotion to God. Many Hindus direct their devotion to Krishna; they believe that if they focus their love on him he will be their route to moksha. <p>How did Buddha teach his followers to find enlightenment? Enlightenment means having a fully awake understanding. Buddhists believe:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> All humans have the potential to be enlightened or awakened spiritually. The Buddha achieved enlightenment sitting under a Bodhi tree. He worked out what was wrong with humans – that we all experience suffering. The Buddha explained his ideas as Four Noble Truths. 	<p>How do Christians try to capture the mystery of God as Trinity? Christians struggle to express the idea of the Trinity. It is a mystery. Christians believe:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Christians believe in one God but they experience Him in three ways (Father, Son, Holy Spirit). When Jesus was baptised all three persons of the Trinity were present. When Jesus left earth, he asked his followers to baptise new Christians 'in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.' <p>Why do Humanists say happiness is the goal of life? Jesus summed this up with the Golden Rule: 'In everything do to others as you would have them do to you.' God is King. The Bible and the parables of Jesus teach the right way to live. The Lord's Prayer is an important prayer because it is about wanting God's kingdom to come. Christians want to be part of spreading God's kingdom on earth. <p>What symbols and stories help Jewish people remember their covenant with God? Covenant means promise. Jewish people believe:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The rainbow is a sign of the first covenant with God. Abraham was called into a covenant with God. The Exodus was God's rescue of the Jewish nation from Egyptian slavery. God summoned the Jewish people to Mount Sinai to renew their Covenant with them. 	<p>Why do Christians call themselves the 'Body of Christ'? That the 'Body of Christ' is lots of people joined together like a body with Jesus Christ as the head. It is another name for the church. Like salt, Christians should encourage 	<p>What is the great significance of the 'Eucharist' to Christians? The Eucharist is when Christians give thanks for bread and wine in memory of Jesus. It is a central act of worship. Christians believe:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is important to give thanks to God. It is a Christian duty. During the Lord's Supper, the Passover feast with his disciples on the evening before he was betrayed, Jesus commanded his followers to remember him. The Eucharist is a reminder of Jesus' sacrifice on their behalf but also of things which should make them glad: of God's amazing love and forgiveness. <p>Why do Christians think being a pilgrim is a good analogy for life itself? Some Christians go on pilgrimage to somewhere important to their faith. Describe what a Christian believes about the Holy Spirit and how he empowers Christians to make a difference in the world.</i></p>	<p>What is the great significance of the 'Eucharist' to Christians? <i>Explain that the last Passover feast Jesus shared with his disciples is known as the Lord's Supper.
